The History and tradition of Nara Medicine

Nara is a place rich with ancient history and culture.

The foundations of Japanese culture were laid by silk road travelers and the goods they brought: of these, medicine was absolutely key. From the late 6th century, medicines were given not only to those of high social status, but also to commoners at a facility called a "Sevakuin".

In the 7th century, "En-no-Gyoja", the founder of the "Shugendo" religious tradition, made a medicine with the bark of wild amur cork trees and herbs from Mt. Omine. It was probably the first medicine sold in Japan, and is widely sold as "Daranisuke-gan" or "Sanko-gan" today.

With this rich history and culture of medicine, its production in homes and free distribution by temples was particularly prominent in Nara. This led to the development of what is known today as Yamato (Nara) medicine.

Even today, a great number of pharmaceutical companies in Nara strive to support peoples' health and promote a healthy lifestyle.

DARANISUKE-GAN

Daranisuke-gan and Sanko-gan are digestive medicines that contain the bark of amur cork trees. Depending on the ingredients contained, they are effective against a variety of digestive conditions.



ROKUSHIN-GAN

The name of "Rokushin-gan" (literally meaning "six gods' pills") refers to six Chinese gods: the blue dragon. the white tiger, the red phoenix, the black tortoise, kirin and snake. It is a cardiotonic containing an ingredient called "senso".











KIO-GAN













A written formula for this medicine was found inside an old drum owned by Todai-ji Temple. Kio-gan is a medicine for night-time crying, fever, and diarrhea in children who are weak perhaps due to malnutrition. Its formula is similar to that of Rokushin-gan without "senso".
