Nara: The Birthplace of Japan

Nara is located in the center of Japan, with a population of 1.3 million, as of now; it is known as the former capital of Japan. The ancient city of Nara flourished as a first international capital of Japan. Nara is also known as the terminal city of the "Silk Road." Back then, the Silk Road was an important trade route. The Japanese ancient culture blended with various foreign cultures introduced through the Silk Road. Since then, we have a long 1300-year history as first capital of Japan. Therefore, Nara is often referred to as the birthplace of Japan. As various things or culture were introduced in Nara through the Silk Road, it often is referred to as the origins of Japan.


Among the traditional industries of Nara Prefecture, many have long histories that go back to the Edo period or the Middle Ages, such as ink, ink brushes, Japanese paper, medicines, lacquerware, somen noodles, refined liquor, tea whisks, and half-split chopsticks. Special products of various areas have been created against the background of the abundant natural environment. Local industries include textiles – such as socks and knitted garments – lumber, and medical products, as well as plastic molding, fur and leather products, and sports goods. There is also flourishing cuttingedge product development suited to the needs of the times that makes good use of the high-level techniques thus developed over time. Moreover, the accumulation of machine industry that uses the newest technology is also advancing.



Access to Major Cities

Nara City and Ikoma City are located in the northernmost part of the prefecture, so access to Osaka and Kyoto is very convenient. The Osaka urban area is also accessible within an hour from places such as Kashihara City and Gose City in central Nara, and Yoshino Town in the south.

Gose IC Region Industrial Aria Formation Project for the Promotion of Chunaawa

The plan is to develop an area for industrial use in the area surrounding GoselC, in the commuting area from the Chunanwaregion, to attract companies and secure enhanced industry promotion, and to guarantee stable employment locations.

Through this model urban planning project, creating an independent regional economic structure in Chunanwa, we plan to accelerate the prevention of population outflow centered around young people and promote UI turns (returning to regional areas).

Nara Prefecture Industrial Locations Incentive (as of March 2021)

Tax cuts

Exemption of real estate acquisition tax Reduction of business tax (75% for 3 years)

Subsidy program

Subsidy to promote strengthening of local sites

Granted to companies investing in the relocation of HQs from the outside of the prefecture or in the expansion of HQs within the prefecture (maximum of ¥100 million).

Business start-up subsidy

Grants to companies that locate their factories and research institutes within the prefecture (up to **¥2 billion** for large-scale lots, **¥1 billion** for medium-sized lots).

Subsidies to promote the location of telecommunications-related businesses Subsidizing capital investment and rent for the establishment of telecommunications businesses.


