
Naoki Ishikawa

Born in Tokyo. Graduated from Tokyo National University of Fine Arts and Music with a doctorate in Fine Arts and Music. Interested in the fields of anthropology and folklore, traveling all over the world, from remote areas to cities, and continuing to exhibit his works.

Received the Newcomer's Prize of the Photographic Society of Japan Award and the Kodansha Publishing Culture Award in 2008 for "NEW DIMENSION" and "POLAR", the Ken Domon Award in 2011 for "CORONA", and the Writer's Prize of the Photographic Society of Japan Award in 2020 for "EVEREST" and "Marebito".

In 2023, received the Higashikawa Award for Distinguished Writers. He is the author of "Saigo no Bokenka (lit. Last Adventurer)" (Ken Kaiko Nonfiction Award) and many other books.
